### About Us

Bay Area Community Resources (BACR) is a nonprofit organization supporting individual and community development throughout the Bay Area. As part of the BACR network, Youth Policy Leaders (YPL) is a peer-led group of community organizers and researchers campaigning for social justice, health equity, and immigrant rights.

### Job Description

The YPL Health Rights campaign is looking for young champions to advocate for health equity in San Francisco's low-income and minority neighborhoods. Selected members will join an ongoing effort to restore their communities by developing policies to combat targeted tobacco industry marketing and increase access to affordable smoke-free housing.

YPL members learn how minority populations are affected by tobacco and how policy change can improve a community's quality of life. Members are also trained to collect and analyze data and share their analysis with local leaders, the media, and the public. In addition to stipends, and training, YPL members can access case management and career coaching through CHALK, otherwise known as Communities in Harmony Advocating for Learning and Kids.
